A YOUNG MAN KILLED ON BOARD A SCARBOROUGH SMACK.—The smack, "Crown Point," Maw, master, arrived in Scarborough harbour yesterday morning with her flag at half-mast, indicating a death on board. On inquiry it was ascertained that the third hand, Chas. M. Maw, brother of the skipper, was accidentally killed on Tuesday morning, the vessel then being at sea, nearly sixty miles from this port. While all hands were engaged in getting in the trawl, with the aid of the steam winch or capstan, the slings broke, and deceased was caught by a part of the rapidly revolving machine, and hurled twice round. The poor fellow was assisted from his position instantly, when it was found that he had sustained some shocking injuries on his head. As soon as the terrible nature of his injuries was seen, the master at once sailed for Scarborough. The man lingered till about ten o'clock on Tuesday night, when he died. Deceased was 23 years of age, and he leaves a widow and child.
