# The last will and Testament

of Simon Marce of  
Kendleham in the Countie of Suffe gent

2

made the last Daye of September one thousand  
five hundred and tenne as followeth. First I bequeath my soule into the handes of almighty  
god my Creator hoping of eternall life and salvation by the deathe and passion of our  
blessed Sord and Saviour Christe Ihesus. And my bodye to be buried in the Churchyard  
of the parische church of Kendleham. And as touching all such goodes and chattels  
landes tenement and hereditaments wherewith yt hath pleased god to bless me I do dispose  
of in manner and forme following. First I give and bequeath unto every one of the children  
of Francis Dymwell of Sutton in the Countie of Suffe gentleman and Jane his wife  
being my grandchildren ffifte poudes a peece of lawfull englishe money. Also to every  
one of the children of William Downinge of Expehall in the sayed Countie of Suffe gent  
and Anne his wife wherof my daughter being three in number fortie poudes a peece  
of lawfull englishe money upon condition that the sayed William Downinge do deliver  
or cause to be delivered unto myne Executors one bond or writing obligatory wherem  
the sayed Simon Marce stand bounde to the sayed William Downinge for the payment  
of one hundred poudes to and amongst such Child or Children of the bodye of the  
sayed Anne as he or she be begotten by the sayed William Downinge and shall happen to  
be living at the tyme of the deathe of me the sayed Simon. Whiche hundred poudes  
to be paid within one yere next after my deathe or to the life effect as in and by the  
sayed writing obligatory more at large dothe and may appere in the condition  
therof. And if the sayed William Downinge shall not deliver the sayed writing obligatory  
within three monethes after reasonable demaund made by my Executors or one of them  
or by any of their assignes. Then I will that my gift and bequest to the children  
of the sayed William Downinge to be frustrate and void. Also I will and bequeath  
unto valentyne Smith of the shire of Suffe in the Countie of Suffe gent and Emboroughe  
his wife being my grandchildre three hundred poudes of lawfull englishe money. And  
to all the rest of the children of the sayed William Smith begotten of the sayed Emboroughe  
to every of them fortie poudes a peece of lawfull englishe money. Also to the daughter  
of Ralph Comyres gent and Mary his wife being my grandchildre fortie poudes of lawfull  
Englishe money. Also to Emboroughe Marie the daughter of George Marie of the do line  
until the age of thirteene yeres ten I give her one hundred poudes of lawfull englishe  
money and not before. Also to Emboroughe Marie the daughter of Thomas Marie three  
hundred poudes of lawfull englishe money. Also I will that all my landes tenement and goods  
in the Countie of Suffe and parte shall be and remaine unto Charles Marce my sonne  
and the heirs of his bodye lawfullie begotten. And if the sayed Charles shall happen to sell  
the sayed landes and tenement that then I will that he shall sell them to Thomas Marce  
or Leonard Marce my sonnes, they or either of them growing to the sayed Charles the full  
value for them. Also I give will and bequeath unto the sayed Charles and unto the  
heirs male of his bodye lawfullie begotten all those my landes and tenement in  
the Countie of Suffe. Also I will that all my manors landes tenement and hereditaments  
to witte the manor of Borge free and Coppe and all my lease and lease landes in the  
parishes of Melton Thredfelde Haxton Woodbridge Petti shire and Dallingham in the Countie  
of Suffe shall be and remaine to my heirs and in such manner and forme as be expressed  
set forth and declared in an indenture Copie made betwene me the sayed Simon  
Marce on the first parte and Henry Warner knight and others on the second parte and  
George Marie gent and others on the third parte bearing date the four and twentieth  
Daye of August in the seventh yere of his Ma<sup>ty</sup> reigne over Eng land ffraunce and
