Leonard Mawe, M^r. of Divinitie Colledge in Cambridge, and by gods great
 mercy to me, though unworthy of that high honor and callinge. Bishopp
 of Bath and Wells, being in perfect health of bodie, and sound in mynde and
 memorie, blessed be god for it consideringe the uncertaintie of this life, and
 suddainnes of death, which hath surprisid many younger then my self. Doe
 make, ordaine, and declare, this my last will and testament, revokinge all former wills
 whatsoever made by me heretofore. First I comende my soule into the hands of god my
 Almighty Creator, with whom the Spiritts of iust and perfect men live, assuredly
 hopinge by his mercy and through the meritts of Christ Iesus my blessed Saviour and
 Redeemer to obtaine perfect remission of all my sinnes in this world, and eternall life
 in the world to come. My bodie I comitt to the earth to be laid vpp in peate hoping
 and lookinge for a ioyfull resurrection to Glorie, after this painefull pilgrimadge
 ended, and for that blessednes which is promised to them that dye in the lord. For
 my worldly goods which are not many, for I never had, nor cared to haue much. I bequeath
 and bestow in manner followinge. First my lande, tenements, and houses in Melton, Wotton,
 Bredfield, Woodbridge in the Countie of Suff. which my father purchased of Thomas or
 Emston, Partridge and Waller I leave to distend to the next heire accordinge to my
 fathers will, and Deede of Assentment. All my lande, tenements, and houses in the Isle of
 Aylesburie in Lincolnshire, lying in Epworth, Ouzby, Luddington, &c. likewise my house
 or tenement in Selby in Yorkshire which my brother Charles left me by last will, in
 consideration of payment of his debts. Also likewise the house or tenement in
 Suff, commonly called the Queens head, which also was left to me by my brother Charles
 for payment of his debts, I give to my cousin Nicholas Mawe sonne of Robert Mawe my
 lovinge uncle and godfather to whom I ought the first beginninge of my fortunes, to him
 I give my forenamed lande, houses, and tenements, lying in Lincolnshire, Yorkshire, and
 Suff, and to the heires male of his bodie lawfully begotten for ever. Likewise I give to
 my said cousin Nicholas Mawe the somme of two hundred poundes in mony, to be paid
 him within one yeare after my death at one intire payment. Item I give to Lewis or
 Smeth my Nephew, sonne to William Smeth of Chiswick in the Countie of Midd
 gent, the somme of fower hundred poundes, the one half to be paid within sixe moneths
 after my death. The other half within other sixe moneths after the first payment. Item
 I give to Elizabeth Smeth, and Kimborough Smeth my neeces daughters to William or
 Smeth of Chiswick aforesaide to each of them an hundred pounde a peece to be paid
 them within a yeare after my death. Item I give to the Colledge where I had my education
 and was both Scholler, fellowe, and Master, commonly called Peterhouse in Cambridge the
 somme of three hundred poundes for the leadinge of their Chappell, if it be not finished
 before my death. If it be, I give it towards the buildinge of the East end of the Coll:
 towards the street. If it be begunn within two yeares after my death, If not it be not
 begun in that tyme, then I give the said three hundred poundes for a perpetuall stocke
 to the Coll: to be laid vpp and kept in Cista Commun, and nothinge to be taken out, or
 expended, without the consent of the Master, and greater part of the fellowes. And I will
 that there be taken a yearely arroumpte of this somme, at the ende of the Coll: arroumpte, soe
 that the somme of three hundred poundes, be still kept, and remayne intire as a perpetuall
 stocke to the Colledge as the mony in Cista Bernardi, is or should be kept without diminucion
 for the benefitt of the fellowes. For due performanc wherof I bynde the consciences of
 the present and succeedinge Masters and fellowes, that they see it employed to the right use.
 And I desire the present Societie to accept of this poore gift of mine as a testimony of
 my thankfullnes unto my annient Nurse from which I received so many blessings and
 furrowe. Item all the plate that was my fathers, all the household stuffe, beddinge, &c.

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Carpets, Shirts, Stools, &c. all the pictures and ornaments I leave and bequeath to the
 heir of the house at Wendlesham. All my other plate silver, gold, Daubers, Salt-stellens, quilt
 Supper with covers, Curtains, Basins &c. I give to my cousin Nicholas Mawe. My books of all
 sorts, Hebrew, Greek, Latin, English, French, Spanish, or Divinitie, Philosophie, Historie
 whatsoever I give to my Nephew Symon Smeth some of William Smeth aforesaid. Item
 I give to Thomas Burwell fellowe of Trinity hall in Cambridge my Nephew, the some
 of one hundred pounds to be paid within one yeare after my death. Item I give to my
 servant Tho: Westombe one hundred pounds to be paid within sixe months after my
 death. Item to my servant Richard Smeth the some of one hundred pounds to be paid
 within sixe months after my death. Item to George Clarke my Coachman twenty pounds
 and two of my Coach horses. The rest of my goods subscrited I leave to be equally
 divided between my two Executors whom I nominate, make, and ordaine to be my cousin
 Nicholas Mawe and Thomas Burwell my Nephew. And I earnestly desire my good friend
 Doctor Tho: Edin, to be Overseer of this my last will and testament, and to advise and
 direct my Executors by his Council. And I will and bequeath to him my annuitie
 friend Doctor Edin for his paines either Twentie pounds in money, or a peere of plate to
 that value at his choice.

 willed from Balerwell in Darbeshire (if he be livinge) one hundred pounds, if he be
 dead, then his sonne Martin Clarke to haue the same. Item I give to my owle friende
 and fellowe M^r Margery Hall for a remembrance my wifes weddinge ringe, And to my
 good friend M^r Thomas Davall I bequeath my silver Porringer, my little silver Drencher
 salt, and the longe wynt bowle of silver. And to his wife my late wifes Chamell pillowcase,
 with a parchment Gould lace about it, and the best paire of Holland sheets, and the best
 Damaste table cloth, with the Suppbord cloth, and a dozen of Damaste Naplins belonginge
 to the same. Item I give and bequeath to my neere my cousin William Hairfaye daughter
 tenne pounds. Item I give and bequeath to Elizabeth Dult fortye shillings. Item to Master
 Thomas Mountford fortye shillings. And to the poore of the parish of Samerwell fortye
 shillings. Item I make, constitute, and ordaine my late wifes kinsman David Williams my
 Executor, and give unto him all the residue of my good, cattell, Chattells, plate, lease, debts
 and ready money whatsoever my debts and legacies paid, And I earnestly intreat my good friende
 M^r Thomas Davall that he would be aydinge and assisting to my Executor in what he may
